Project Description

This project seeks to evaluate academic lessons that develop student support for academic integrity. We are recruiting high school English, social studies or science teachers, within a two-hour travel radius of Milford, CT, who are interested in advancing the ethic of academic integrity through their academic lessons.

We are proposing the development and evaluation of lessons that will help advance student moral awareness, judgment, commitment and behavior in support of academic integrity. We believe the lesson strategy will have application to other issues with social and ethical norms in schools.

Participating teacher teams will work with SEE and our research partner Dr. Jason Stephens (UConn, Storrs) to design lessons which are seamlessly integrated into their curriculum. Schools and teachers will be awarded a stipend, provided site-visits to support lesson development and given citation (if they choose) for this cutting-edge research within any SEE publications. If the project is funded, it will begin January of 2012 and conclude in December of 2014.
