

Protecting the Brand over Students?

There is much in the following story that requires additional research and facts. From one CBS report, we learn that Baylor University's Title IX coordinator, Patty Crawford has resigned in protest over what she claims is a lack of support by senior Baylor administrators. As Title IX coordinator, Crawford was responsible to help process claims of sexual assault on campus.



For over a year, Baylor has been involved in revelations and resignations over reports that indicated the university's response to sexual assaults was "wholly inadequate" with an "overwhelming majority of cases" not even getting a hearing. Investigators painted a picture of a football program that was "above the rules," but said there were "institutional failures at every level." In her resignation and public statements Crawford claims the administration continues to work to "protect the brand [of Baylor] over the students."

SEE cannot begin to claim the full story is revealed here or in the [CBS story link](#), but seeks to have students analyze this case with the facts known as presented. We welcome students to respond on SEE's website to the following questions.
