The Mystery of Medical Billing

Anyone who has experience in paying for health care expenses understands the frustration and confusion associated with medical billing. With or without insurance, health care costs often lack transparency and vary unexplainably within and outside of regions of the US.



CBS News is reporting on the cost variance of similar procedures and recognize a blood test could vary in price between \$15 to \$126 and an ultrasound from \$115 to \$2,459. Arriving at these billing estimates is also a problem in the health industry. Unlike shopping for cars, homes and insurance itself, there is no online research resource for consumers to compare prices between hospitals or between doctors. During a health crisis when insurance doesn't cover procedures, or when someone is uninsured, the need to quickly understand pricing is critically important.

The secrecy of health care costs presents an ethical question. Students are asked to consider, what core ethical values are demonstrated (or compromised) when hospitals or doctors fail to provide transparency in their medical billing? In addition, what ideas would students suggest ensuring the cost of medical procedures are more accessible to potential patients?
