Paid Internship to support Laws of Life Essay Program

The School for Ethical Education (SEE) is a non-profit teaching agency that provides training and programs for character and ethics education. SEE uses the strategies of teacher training through in-service or college courses, district and school wide consulting and program administration to implement character education. SEE does not discriminate based on age, sex, race, religion, national origin, marital status, or handicap.

This internship is a part-time position in support of SEE's Laws of Life Essay program and is 100 percent dependent upon grant funding or donations. Hiring preference will be given to college upper classman and graduate students in business marketing, communication or secondary education majors.

Job Description

The intern's responsibilities will include supporting the Director in: 1. Disseminating information about the Laws of Life Essay program throughout Connecticut by mailings (electronic and traditional), school visits, faxes, website and press releases, 2. Recruiting teachers in target schools to participate in the contest, 3. Tracking all contacts made for assessment of contest community outreach, 4. Assisting in communication with project schools and donors, 5. Recruiting and facilitating communication with statewide essay contest judges, 6. Supporting communication with essay participants (teachers and writers) regarding notification of winners and awards reception, 7. Soliciting gift bag awards for winners of the contest, 8. Supporting the hosting of an awards reception for contest winners, 9. Completing a final contest report for funders, and 10. Other duties as assigned.

Work Hours and Location

Program work will be conducted primarily from SEE's offices in Milford. The days and hours are flexible (average 12 hrs/week) and will be arranged with the Director and in coordination with other intern schedules. Interns turn in a weekly timecard and will be paid at a rate of \$TBA/hour with a maximum 400 hours from September 1, to May 27. By accepting this position, applicants agree with all reasonable confidence that they will complete the project employment through the end of May and reserve the evening of the first Wednesday in May for the agency's annual celebration dinner. There are no additional financial or leave benefits associated with this position. Dress code is considered business casual.
